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The Moot Court Bench is Sri Lanka's first fully integrated legal advocacy training platform. The main aim of the MCB is enhancing the standard of the legal profession, by delivering education of global standards for Sri Lankan law students focusing on International Commercial Arbitration, International Trade Law, International Commercial Mediation and Negotiation. The MCB aims to provide a platform for law students to develop the necessary skills in written and oral advocacy, while learning the subjects of International International Commercial Arbitration. Commercial Mediation and Negotiation, and International Trade Law in depth. This platform is targeted at providing a high standard of legal education for law students and is completely administered by passionate volunteers and alumni with no profit motive.

Taking into consideration the current development trajectory of Sri Lanka, the building of infrastructure such as the Port City and Sri Lanka's geographical positioning in the 21st Century Maritime Silk Road, Sri Lanka has a strong potential of becoming one of Asia's leading economies by 2040. The expected inflow of business and investment will create a need for Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR), as court litigation will not be accessible to all nor as effective and practical. The MCB stands to benefit the Sri Lankan Economy through catering to the vacuum which is being created for practitioners of ADR. The prevalence of ADR practice has greatly benefited countries such as Singapore and the knowledge and skills inculcated by the MCB would kickstart the promotion of ADR in the future of Sri Lanka, as it is not as prevalent in the present.

The United States Department of Commerce Commercial Law Development Program (CLDP) along with the Sri Lanka Vis Alumni Network are key partners in several of the MCB's programs.

THE INTERNATIONAL COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION (ICA) PROGRAM

WHAT IS ARBITRATION?

Arbitration is a highly practiced form of Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) globally. It facilitates a speedy, efficient, and binding method of resolving disputes away from the backlog and bureaucracy of courtrooms. The Parties to the Arbitration are represented by their respective counsels in front of an Arbitral Tribunal which has either been appointed by the parties or by the Arbitral Institution. Despite lacking the authority of courtrooms, the Arbitral Tribunal will render an Award, which is considered as the decision of the Arbitral Tribunal, after the conclusion of the arbitral proceedings and such Awards will be binding on the Parties concerned.

IS IT FOR YOU?

Learning arbitration will present you with many new avenues in your career as arbitration has been accepted widely inside Sri Lanka, and to an even greater extent outside.

THE ICA PROGRAM

The International Commercial Arbitration Program saw its inception in the year 2020. The Moot Court Bench was aware that arbitration was moving forward in leaps and bounds around the world. Simultaneously, we were also aware of the lack of resources available to students who were keen on learning this trade. Thus, the ICA Program is aimed at advancing the state of Arbitration in Sri Lanka by catering to the lacuna of resources available to students. That is, to provide law students around the world, primarily in Sri Lanka, an opportunity to learn arbitration and hone other advocacy skills.

While the ICA Program is organised solely by The Moot Court Bench, The United States Department of Commerce, Commercial Law Development Program (CLDP) is a key partner of the ICA Program.

ROGRAMS

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The ICA Program would extend from the beginning of June 2022 to the end of August 2022. During this three-month period, the participants are taught the basics of International Commercial Arbitration, the United Nations Convention on the International Sale of Goods (CISG), written advocacy in the form of legal memoranda and oral advocacy in the form of legal submissions. The Course is taught by MCB Alumni who are Law Students with sound knowledge in the respective areas.

The ICA Program classes would take place during weekends for the duration of the three months. In addition to learning the theoretical aspect of arbitration, the participants will be taught and given an opportunity to test their practical knowledge through the deep dive into the 29th Vis Moot Problem and the mooting sessions.

NATIONAL SELECTION ROUNDS

After the course of three-months, the Top four contenders from each University will be selected to represent their University in the National Round of the ICA Program. Thereafter, the Top two Teams will be selected to participate as the teams from Sri Lanka in the Prestigious Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot which is held annually in Vienna, Austria or its sister moot, the Willem C. Vis East International Commercial Arbitration Moot which is held annually in Hong Kong.

THE WILLEM C. VIS INTERNATIONAL COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION MOOT

Known globally as the Vis Moot, this phenomenon is ranked amongst the Top 10 Moots in the world. A moot is a mock legal proceeding, where law students take on the role of a fully-fledged legal counsel and renowned legal practitioners or justices take on the role of the adjudicator. The Vis Moot endorses and promotes the usage of Arbitral Rules of various international institutions such as the London Court of International Arbitration (LCIA) and the Hong Kong Institute of International Arbitration (HKIAC). It also promotes the United Nations Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration, the UNIDROIT Principles on

International Commercial Contracts, and the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods, better known as the CISG.

The Vis Moot is held annually in Vienna, Austria, whereas its sister moot, the Vis East Moot is held annually in Hong Kong. The Moots record a participation of close to 400 teams and 150 teams respectively. Both moots revolve around the same Moot Problem, a fictitious international commercial case study. Participants are benefited with extensive knowledge in a field which they would not otherwise explore as law students, superior legal advocacy skills and the opportunity to network with law students and practitioners around the globe.

THE INTERNATIONAL COMMERCIAL **MEDIATION (ICM) PROGRAM**

WHAT IS MEDIATION?

Mediation is a process in which disputing parties agree to a neutral third-party facilitator to assist them to reach a mutually beneficial settlement of the issues in dispute and rests on the principles of confidentiality, impartiality, voluntariness, and self-determination of the outcome.

As a versatile ADR mechanism, Mediation is utilised in a vast range of dispute settlement processes ranging from Family and Community conflicts to Criminal and Investor-State disputes. It is most widely used, however, in the Commercial context. Mediation embodies values that are celebrated in the corporate field: efficiency, cost-effectiveness and preservation of commercial relationships.

In fact, it has long been integrated as part of the rich Sri Lankan history and the Asian culture as an amicable dispute resolution mechanism. In today's world, where there is a search for not just quantity control of caseloads but also an improvement in the quality of justice and where commercial disputes have widespread effects on communities, populations and entire nations, Mediation offers a path that protects relationships, produces a win-win outcome, and provides for a stable and sound economic environment.

THE ICM PROGRAM

The Commercial Mediation Program in an initiative to train law and business students in commercial mediation and mediation advocacy skills to provide the necessary platform for our young professionals who will inevitably become the future leaders of the Mediation and ADR arenas regionally and internationally.

The ICM Program of 2021 introduced a generation of young students into commercial mediation, and we are hopeful to present an improved and more comprehensive version of the experience to this year's cohort of trainees in 2022.

As we move into the second edition of the ICM Program, we are expanding our material to not just create future attorneys skilled in Advocacy, but also the next generation of future mediators who will enhance the ADR spheres of Sri Lanka and the international arena.

The training will therefore include training not just limited to advocacy but also in adopting the mediator role, and both skills will be utilized at the Competition Rounds which will require the students to negotiate commercial disputes with the facilitation of student mediators.



THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE LAW (ITL) PROGRAM

WHAT IS TRADE LAW?

International trade law governs how States may restrict or regulate trade in goods and services. It is predominantly governed by the World Trade Organization (WTO) agreements, with some States also party to bilateral, plurilateral, or regional preferential trade agreements.

At the WTO, there is a complex set of rules dealing with trade in goods and services and the protection of intellectual property rights. WTO law addresses a broad spectrum of issues, ranging from tariffs, import quotas and customs formalities to compulsory licensing, food safety regulations and national security measures. These laws interact to reduce trade barriers between WTO Members while providing a framework to restrict trade for necessary measures to protect or promote important societal values. Therefore, at the heart of WTO disputes is balancing these competing interests.

IS IT FOR YOU?

An understanding of international trade law opens doors to many opportunities at the domestic and international levels. International trade law fits anyone interested in economics, public international law, alternative dispute resolution, trade and regulation.

THE JOHN H. JACKSON MOOT

The MCB International Trade Law (ITL) Program, which runs from June 2022 to June 2023, educates students on the rules of International Trade Law, through participation in the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition. The John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition is a simulated hearing under the rules of the WTO dispute settlement system, organized by the European Law Students' Association (ELSA) with the technical support of the WTO and attracts circa 100 teams annually.

Teams will be required to prepare and analyse a fictitious case and present their arguments both as a complainant and a respondent. Teams will submit a written memorial, which will be followed by oral rounds, where they will present arguments in front of a panel that consists of international trade law experts. Oral rounds will consist of firstly the West and South Asian

Regional Rounds. Successful teams will then have the chance to go on to participate in the Global Final Rounds in the WTO Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.

THE PROGRAM

In preparation for the moot, participants will learn about how disputes in International Trade are settled between countries in the WTO, from experts in the field, and through the 'WTO and US Trade Law and Policy' course offered by the American University Washington College of Law. Teams will go through a comprehensive nine-month training in written and oral advocacy which will help participants stand out both academically and in their legal career.


